City Mission, an ecumenical faith-based organization, created the Urban Pastoral Ministry Program as a residency program that supports the development and growth of new pastors who are committed to excellence in pastoral ministry in urban communities. City Mission, in cooperation with four local Boston churches, selected four recent seminary graduates to serve as residents for two years in the four congregations. The senior pastors at these congregations are mentoring

residents and providing opportunities for residents to take a leadership role in all aspects of the congregation's ministry. The residents spend one-third of their time at City Mission, focusing on building partnerships between congregations and community organizations and learning from and reflecting with other residents.

# Notes on Today's Music

from MITCHELL CRAWFORD

February is Black History Month, a time when our music should reflect the many and varied contributions of African American composers and arrangers to the repertory of sacred music, and to celebrate musical forms (i.e., the spiritual) and styles (i.e., Jazz) that arose from within African American communities. Were we only to feature the music of African Americans during February, it would be the very definition of tokenism; however, Old South's music program embraces an intentionally broad reach, and we are proud to showcase works that highlight diversity throughout the year.

How then should we honor Black History Month? My own inclination is to offer works which allow us to absorb and appreciate the development of the African American Spiritual, a genre I consider to be one of the greatest and most significant within American music. Thus, during February, the Festival Choir will offer each week arrangements which, collectively, allow us to chart the evolution of this multifaceted repertory.

Born in Memphis, Tennessee, **Wendell Whalum** was already an established church musician by the time of his graduation from Booker T. Washington High School, having held positions at Avery Chapel and Providence A.M.E. Churches, as well as Memphis's Central Baptist Church. He attended Morehouse College — obtaining the Bachelor's degree in 1952 — and, upon completion of the Master's degree from Columbia University the following year, returned to his *alma mater* as a member of the faculty. Once there, he was quickly appointed Director of the **Morehouse College Glee Club**, which rose to national prominence over the course of his thirty-four year tenure.

Beyond the academy, Whalum received international acclaim through his work as a composer and arranger. He was a talented organist, concertizing widely and performing as soloist with the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra in 1968. His relationship with the ASO extended to his work preparing choruses — typically the Morehouse College Glee Club and the Atlanta University Center Community Chorus — for numerous Symphonic collaborations in a variety of repertoire. Throughout his career, Whalum maintained involvement in church music, serving a number of churches in metropolitan Atlanta. Most notable among these was the Ebenezer Baptist Church, which The Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. co-pastored from 1960–1968.
