

Welcome! We are a progressive Christian church first gathered in 1669. The Church played a significant role in early American history. We continue to outfit ourselves for mission and ministry in the 21st century as a thriving urban church in the heart of Boston. HEARING ASSISTED DEVICES

Old South has installed a **Hearing Loop** in the Sanctuary, the latest technology in hearing assisted devices.

- 1. If you have a hearing aid: the loop works directly for those whose hearing aids have a "T-Coil."
- 2. If you are hard of hearing but don't use an aid: ask for one the devices that is aired with the loop.

The sound is best if you sit further inside the pews, away from the aisles. The loop does not work in the upper galleries.

GARAGE PARKING VALIDATIONS

We have arrangements for discounted parking with two nearby garages for Old South Church worship or church business (excluding weddings and concerts):

- 1. Park at the **Garage@100 Clarendon** (behind Back Bay Station), have your ticket validated at our Front Desk, and **you** pay the discounted rate of \$7 for up to 3 hours. Old South bears no cost.
- 2. Park at the **Prudential Garage** for up to 5 hours on Saturday or Sunday, have your ticket validated at our Front Desk, and the Prudential Garage will bill **Old South** (costing us \$15k \$20k per year).

SPONSOR A MEMORIAL LEAF

Memorial Leaf sponsors wanted to honor early members of African descent.

Our Columbarium's Phase 2 features a *bas* relief tree with brass leaves you can purchase to have engraved with the names of loved ones who have died at \$250 per leaf.

However, the first 63 leaves will be engraved with, and are reserved for, the names of members of Old South Church who were enslaved and who, so far as we know, were not laid to rest in marked graves. On each such leaf we will engrave the name of one enslaved person and the only date we have for them: the date of their baptism or membership at Old South Church. The cost of sponsoring such a leaf will be \$75. To sponsor a leaf, contact helen@oldsouth.org.

On an historical note: During the late 1600s, through the 1700s and into the early 1800s, Old

South Church welcomed into membership more persons of African descent and more enslaved persons than any other church in Boston. Our Open Door has been swinging wide for some time.
