

NOTES ON TODAY'S MUSIC

Born near the turn of the century in Jarratt, Virginia, **Undine Smith Moore** (1904–1989) was the granddaughter of slaves. She began composing music while a student at Fisk University, and in 1924 became the first graduate of Fisk to receive a scholarship to The Juilliard School. Following her graduation — *cum laude* — in 1926, she briefly relocated to North Carolina before returning to Virginia following her appointment to the faculty of Virginia State College (now University) in 1927. There, Moore taught piano, organ, and music theory until her retirement in 1972 — a staggering 45 year tenure at a single institution.

Moore, who was lovingly known as the "Dean of Black Women Composers," is widely remembered for her choral works, though she wrote for varieties of instruments and ensembles as well. Her "Scenes from the Life of a Martyr," a 16-part oratorio on the life of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., was nominated for a Pulitzer Prize in 1981. During that same year, Moore gave the keynote address to the First National Congress on Women in Music, wherein she expressed the feeling she was "a teacher who composes, rather than a composer who teaches." The academy rewarded her dedication to the profession: among her many accolades are

the Humanitarian award from Fisk University and an honorary doctorate from Indiana University.

Amy Marcy Cheney Beach (1867–1944) — known throughout her published works as "Mrs. H. H. A. Beach" — had a significant career as a pianist and composer during the latter part of the 19th century and early decades of the 20th. Born in New Hampshire to musically inclined parents, she was prodigiously talented from a young age. Following the family's move to Chelsea, Suffolk County, in 1875, Amy began studying in Boston, making her concert debut in an 1883 "Promenade Concert" at the Boston Music Hall. Following her marriage in 1885, she devoted herself almost exclusively to composition. She was acclaimed as among America's foremost composers in critical reviews of the 1890s, and saw a number of groundbreaking works published and performed, her Gaelic Symphony, (the first such work composed and published by an American woman) and Piano Concerto (which she premiered as soloist with the Boston Symphony Orchestra) among them. Following the death of her husband, she relocated to Manhattan and became especially associated with St. Bartholomew's Church. She is buried in the Forest Hills Cemetery of Jamaica Plain.

Rosephanye Powell serves as a Professor of Voice at Auburn University in Alabama. Hailed as one of America's premier women composers of choral music, she has so far focused her research on the the African-American spiritual, the art songs of William Grant Still, and voice-care concerns for choral singers and directors. Powell is in great demand as conductor and clinician, frequently appearing at regional and national conventions of the American Choral Directors Association as well as All-State and Honor Choir festivals. She has an impressive catalogue of works published by leading national and international publishers, and her compositions are routinely praised for their rhythmic energy, colorful harmonies, and well-crafted vocal lines. Dr. Powell holds degrees from Florida State University, Westminster Choir College, and Alabama State University.
