The large Bible processed into worship today by Old South member Dr. John Wadlington, was published in 1716 (New Testament) and 1717 (Old Testament & Apocrypha). It was a gift to the church from Sir Francis Wilkes upon the completion in 1730 of our new meeting house, today's Old South Meeting House. It is from this Bible that Phillis Wheatley and Samuel Adams heard the scriptures read. We bring it out today in honor of Reformation Sunday and the reformers' reliance on scripture and informed interpretation.

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Notes on Today's Music from MITCHELL CRAWFORD

Reformation Day commemorates the date (October 31, 1517) that Martin Luther nailed his *Ninety-five Theses* on the door of the *Schlosskirche* of Wittenberg Castle, an action which reverberated across the Holy Roman Empire and heralded the start of the Protestant Reformation. Owing to the centrality of Luther to the events that shaped the reformation, it has become routine for churches to mark the occasion with musical tributes of a Germanic flavor: indeed, this is how Old South observed Reformation Sunday last year, with music of Baroque composer Heinrich Schütz alongside a *concertato* setting of the Lutheran chorale *Wer nur den lieben Gott.* Today's service, however, takes as its point of departure the UCC notion that "God is still speaking," and our choral music reflects this wide embrace. The texts of our anthems make clear the priorities of the modern, progressive church, and serve as an implicit call to action to those (we) who have for many decades allowed spurious, selective orthodoxies espoused by the theologically conservative to nevertheless define the general public's perception of what it means to be a Christian in the United States.

It is also a great honor, and highly appropriate, that we should have worshipping with us this Reformation Sunday two individuals who have profoundly shaped the way we Reformed Christians sing about our faith: Old South's Senior Minister Emeritus, **The Rev. Dr. James W. Crawford**, who chaired the committee responsible for *The New Century Hymnal* (1995), and **Mary Louise Bringle**, chair of the Presbyterian Committee on Congregational Song, responsible for creating the hymnal *Glory to God* (2013), and author of our 350th Anniversary Hymn. While Dr. Crawford's work on *New Century* is well known — especially among this congregation — it bears repeating that it effectively moved the needle on inclusive language to such extent that nearly every mainline hymnal since has incorporated its reforms to some degree. Likewise, Dr. Bringle has guided the creation of a hymnal celebrated for its emphasis on justice and successful blending of many musical traditions and eras. It is my great delight to welcome them, and to thank them for their lasting contributions to congregational song.
