Notes on Today's Music

from MITCHELL CRAWFORD

February is Black History Month, a time when our music should reflect the many and varied contributions of African American composers and arrangers to the repertory of sacred music, and to celebrate musical forms (i.e., the spiritual) and styles (i.e., Jazz) that arose from within African American communities. Were we only to feature the music of African Americans during February, it would be the very definition of tokenism; however, Old South's music program embraces an intentionally broad reach, and we are proud to showcase works that highlight diversity throughout the year.

How then should we honor Black History Month? My own inclination is to offer works which allow us to absorb and appreciate the musical development of the African American Spiritual, a genre I consider to be one of the greatest and most significant within American music. Thus, during February, the Festival Choir will offer each week arrangements which, collectively, allow us to chart the evolution of this multifaceted repertory.

Born near the turn of the century in Jarratt, Virginia, **Undine Smith Moore** (1904–1989) was the granddaughter of slaves. She began composing music while a student at Fisk University, and in 1924 became the first graduate of Fisk to receive a scholarship to The Juilliard School. Following her graduation — *cum laude* — in 1926, she briefly relocated to North Carolina before returning to Virginia following her appointment to the faculty of Virginia State College (now University) in 1927. There, Moore taught piano, organ, and music theory until her retirement in 1972 — a staggering 45 year tenure at a single institution.

Moore, who during her lifetime was lovingly regarded the "Dean of Black Women Composers," is widely remembered for her choral works, though she wrote for varieties of instruments and ensembles as well. Her *Scenes from the Life of a Martyr*, a 16-part oratorio on the life of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., was nominated for a Pulitzer Prize in 1981. During that same year, Moore gave the keynote address to the *First National Congress on Women in Music*, wherein she expressed the feeling she was "a teacher who composes, rather than a composer who teaches." The academy rewarded her dedication to the profession: among her <u>many</u> accolades are the Humanitarian award from Fisk University and an honorary doctorate from Indiana University.
