Many: we gather now to find our voices for the speaking of truth to power.


One: In the desire to lift our lamp beside the golden door You have opened, Many: we gather with You, with one another, to re-kindle our light and let it so shine before all people.



### **GREEN TIP: BUY IN BULK**

More and more grocery stores are implementing bulk sections, which is fantastic for those of us who wish to eliminate food packaging. The bulk sections are usually comprised of a few aisles of items like flour, sugar, spices, nuts, cereals, grains, and candy that are completely package-free. The trick? Bring your own containers (cloth cinch bags for the dry foods, mason jars or bottles for the wet). One of the best resources to find local bulk items is Litterless.com, which lists stores and online marketplaces that are bringing back bulk.
