NOTES ON TODAY'S MUSIC

Moses Hogan, one of the last century's greatest and most significant arrangers of the negro spiritual, was born in New Orleans to a musical family which included his father (who sang in the choir at A. L. Davis New Zion Baptist Church) and uncle (who was the church's Minister of Music and Organist). Hogan's musicianship was prodigious: by the age of 9, he was already an accomplished pianist. As a sophomore, he enrolled in the New Orleans Center for Creative Arts High School and was a member of its very first graduating class in 1975.

Further study followed at Oberlin Conservatory of Music and the Juilliard School, and he later studied in Vienna. During his years as (primarily) a piano soloist, Hogan won a number of competitions, including first prize in the Kosciuszko Foundation's Chopin Competition in New York. Increasingly, though, Hogan was engaging with and arranging choral music. In 1980, he formed the *New World Ensemble*, which became an early vehicle for his compositions. By 1993, he'd gone on to found the eponymous *Moses Hogan Chorale*, which was supplanted in 1997 by the *Moses Hogan Singers*. Their first album, a priceless compendium of Hogan's spiritual arrangements, was released in 2002.

Hogan died just a year later at the age of 45. His impact on choral music was profound — you can find his arrangements in the repertoire of most any high school, college, church, community, or professional choir. Moreover, his treatment of the spiritual opened new avenues of stylistic development within the genre. He was a natural successor to the era of arrangers which included William Dawson, who'd similarly raised the form to new heights and unlocked possibilities previously latent within. Hogan's spirituals embrace a dizzying number of influences, from blues to barbershop, and are incredibly well crafted — Hogan knows the voice and, as a result, can coax a colorful array of sounds, textures, and moods from the ensemble. In "I Got a Robe", which we hear this morning, a soloist weaves the melodic thread overtop backing vocals from the choir (which makes the most of its interjections between verses!). There is a discernible playfulness in the setting, especially evident in the winking statement, "Everybody talkin' 'bout heaven ain't going there".
