

# NOTES ON TODAY'S MUSIC

It is hard to overstate the importance of **Henry Thacker ("Harry") Burleigh** (1866–1949) to the development of the spiritual as a genre within western music. Burleigh was a composer, arranger, and professional singer renowned for his baritone voice. It is perhaps the last of these — Burleigh's vocal training in the classical tradition — that made him such an effective conveyer of the spiritual to audiences otherwise ignorant of the rich variety the genre comprised. His arrangements for solo voice cast the spiritual in the guise of the western Art Song — softening the rhythmic and harmonic contours of the melodic material, adding simple piano accompaniments — allowing them to be easily absorbed by new audiences eager to experience this music. A few of Burleigh's solos were later adapted into arrangements for full choir; among these is the setting of "Wade in the Water" we hear today.

Composer and Church Musician **Mark A. Miller** serves as Assistant Professor of Church Music at Drew Theological School and is a Lecturer in the Practice of Sacred Music at Yale University. He also serves as Minister of Music for Christ Church, Summit, New Jersey. A crusader for progressive theology and inclusive music for worship, Miller has said his dream is that the music he composes, performs, teaches and leads will inspire and empower people to create community. To that end, Miller has led music for United Methodists and others around the country, including directing music for the Methodist's General Conference in 2008. He has dozens of hymns and anthems in print — and, given the universally progressive orientation of the texts he sets, this points to the hunger for affirming, uplifting texts which convey modern values around inclusion and belonging. Lastly, speaking of texts, the one set by Miller in "God Has Work For Us to Do" was authored by none other than the Rev. Dr. Carl Daw, who Old Southers will recall helped shape this year's Lenten season through his Psalter paraphrases.
