NOTES ON TODAY'S MUSIC

British Composer **Gustav Holst** (1874–1934) is best remembered today for his orchestral suite *The Planets*, written in an opulent style he would later abandon. Holst found inspiration in the English folksong revival of the early 20th century, and above all, in the works of his close friend and fellow composer, Ralph Vaughan Williams. Vaughan Williams, an agnostic, unwittingly became a seminal figure in 20th century sacred music, making significant and diverse contributions to the genre over the long span of his life and career. Among the earliest was the 1906 edition of *The English Hymnal*, which Vaughan Williams edited (and contributed a few original tunes: SINE NOMINE — "For All the Saints" — being one). In soliciting material for the hymnal — harmonizations, arrangements, newlycomposed original tunes, etc. — it was natural Vaughan Williams should turn to Holst, who contributed a now famous setting of "In the Bleak Midwinter," as well as a harmonization of a melody from the *Genevan Psalter*. He paired this music with an English metrical paraphrase of Psalm 86 dating from around 1620 — roughly contemporaneous with the *Psalter*.

Holst returned to the Genevan-tuned Psalm 86 in the following decade, pairing it with an arrangement of Psalm 150 which uses the familiar LASST UNS ERFREUEN (perhaps best know as "All Creatures of Our God and King," though the tune accommodates many texts, including the Doxology — "Praise God from whom all blessings flow"). Composition on Holst's *Two Psalms* was completed in 1912, though they would remain unpublished until 1920.

With simple and repetitive rhythm, Holst's treatment of the Genevan tune casts a pall over the music of the Psalm, which is stark and austere (one commentator suggests "monastic"). Helpful in the conjuration of this aura is the minor, Dorian modality which permeates the work's harmony. In service to the text, the setting takes on a general bleakness, and a feeling of otherworldliness. Though Holst's work concludes with a full-voiced presentation of the tune, the energy cannot be sustained, and the piece ultimately dies away: against the neutral backdrop of a C major chord, two plucked bass notes trail off into vast silence.

Coffee Hours through April 15




