Open Door Recipient

Today, with joy, Old South Church recognizes Melvin B. Miller with its Open Door Award, presented annually on Phillis Wheatley Sunday to a hero of social justice and civil rights, inclusivity and equity.

Mr. Miller's career of active involvement in Boston's political and public affairs spans more than five decades. He is perhaps best-known and most admired as the ground-breaking journalist who, in 1965, founded the Bay State Banner, a weekly newspaper advocating for the interests of Boston's African American community, which he served as publisher and editor until his recent retirement. Among his many forms of civic and governmental engagement, he served terms as Assistant U.S. Attorney for the District of Massachusetts, and as a member of the National Advisory Council to American Companies doing business in South Africa under the Sullivan Principles until the fall of apartheid and has somehow found time to serve as well on banking boards, civic commissions, and academic trustees.

Throughout his long career, Mr. Miller has been a champion of civil rights and social justice, and fundamentally helped to shape the conversation around these issues in our city and far beyond. Today, in the spirit of Phillis Wheatley, Old South Church honors his dedication and courage in presenting the Open Door Award to Melvin B. Miller.

Ade is an award-winning playwright and screenwriter and founder of Spora Stories. Her plays include her acclaimed debut, Pandora's Box, which won a Best New Play nomination in the Off-West End Theatre Awards and was shortlisted for the \$100,000 Nigeria Prize for Literature, Africa's biggest literary award. It toured to 17 UK venues. Her play The Court Must Have a Queen, commissioned by Historic Royal Palaces, was performed in the Great Hall at Hampton Court Palace. A double Fulbrighter, Ade is a '22-'23 Fulbright Distinguished International Scholar at Emerson College. Her original new play, Phillis in London, dramatizes and re-imagines Phillis Wheatley as an enslaved African Woman writer abroad in Georgian London, 'celebrated' by the elite of the capital of the British empire, at the height of the Transatlantic Slave Trade. She's become a friend of Old South, and we're so pleased to welcome her back on Phillis Wheatley Sunday!
