This week we again hear the music of Larry King, former Director of Music and Organist at Trinity Church, Wall Street, New York. *Fanfares to the Tongues of Fire* was commissioned for the dedication of the Festival Trumpet stop of the organ at Riverside Church, also in New York. The work as a whole has the character of an improvisation. The Gregorian chant *Veni, Creator Spiritus (Come, Holy Spirit)* serves as the subject material for both the fanfares meant to evoke the descent of the Holy Spirit from Heaven "like a rush of mighty wind" and the softer, meditative sections interspersed between them.
