A Note on Today's Prelude from George Sargeant, Associate Organist and Choirmaster:

Towards the end of his life, J.S. Bach set himself the task of revising and expanding a number of chorale preludes which he had written in earlier years. The completed project came to be known as the "18 Great" or "Leipzig" Chorales. Three of them are settings of the chorale (hymn) *Allein Gott in der Höh sei Ehr (All Glory be to God on High)*, sometimes sung in Lutheran churches on Trinity Sunday. Today's prelude is the first of the three and treats the chorale melody in an elaborately ornamented fashion after the style of Bach's mentor Dietrich Buxtehude. The text is a paraphrase of the *Gloria* of the Roman Catholic Mass. Though it invokes each person of the Trinity, it curiously does not mention them *as* the Trinity.
