All: Hear us, O God. (A period of silence is observed as we each hold God's earth, its nations, peoples and leaders in our hearts.)

One: O Compassionate God, hear our prayers, answer them according to your will, and make us channels of your infinite grace; through Jesus Christ we pray.

All: Amen.

One: Now, in the words that Jesus taught us, we pray together, saying:
