MIDDLE PASSAGE REMEMBRANCE CEREMONY

All-Church Worship at 10:00 a.m. on Sunday, August 27th

Gathered in 1669, Old South Church in Boston continues to research, name and account for a history which includes radical abolitionists and the first anti-slavery tract on this soil (1700) AND many early ministers and members who were enslavers, who benefited from the forced enslavement and unpaid work of countless persons of African descent. We will honor the lives of our African members from the 1600s, 1700s, and early 1800s on Middle Passage Sunday. This week's offering will go to the Middle Passage Ceremonies & Port Markers Project, a non-profit organization whose mission is to honor the two million captive Africans who perished during the transatlantic crossing known as the Middle Passage and the ten million who survived to build the Americas. The collected offering will be matched by a grant from the Christian Service and Outreach Committee.
