NOTES ON TODAY'S MUSIC

Psalm 95 Come, let us sing with joy unto the Lord

There is no Hebrew superscription for Psalm 95, as is true of nearly all the "enthronement psalms". The earliest records of daily prayer services (the Daily Office) in Western Christianity indicate that Ps. 95 was used every day at Matins to introduce the psalmody. The first English Book of Common Prayer (1549) continued this practice for Morning Prayer, and it has been a part of Anglican/Episcopal worship ever since. Traditionally referred to by its Latin incipit, Venite, the usual liturgical form omits the final section except on penitential occasions such as Ash Wednesday and the Fridays in Lent. An earlier version of this paraphrase was previously published in my collection A Year of Grace: Hymns for the Church Year (Hope Publishing Co., 1990), p. 107.

- Stanza 1: Anyone uncomfortable with singing "the Lord" may substitute "our God" in the opening lines of the first two stanzas and "our sovereign God" in the first line of the third stanza.
- Stanzas 2–3: The second and third stanzas celebrate the sovereignty God enjoys by virtue of being the Creator of all things. It is interesting to note that the Creator described here is more like that of the second creation account (Gen. 2:4b–25) than the first (Gen.1:1–2:4a).
- Stanza 4: This optional stanza refers to events at Meribah and Massah, when the people in the wilderness tested God (see Exod. 17:1–7; Num. 14:26–35). This portion of Ps. 95 found early use among Christians, as is evident from a sermon in the book of Hebrews (Heb. 3:7–4:16).

This paraphrase was specifically created for use with the Genevan psalm tune OLD 124TH, which also enjoyed great popularity in England, Scotland and the Netherlands.
