## DONALD A. WELLS PREACHING PRIZE WINNER ANNOUNCED



The Donald A. Wells Preaching Prize is awarded yearly to a student in any of the theological schools in the Southern NE Conference of the UCC. The prize was established in 2007 by the Massachusetts Bible Society in honor of retiring Executive Director Donald Wells honoring the best social justice sermon based on Biblical texts. This year's recipient is Andrea Barton Reeves, who is a Social Justice Scholar working toward her Master of Arts in Religion degree at Yale Divinity School. Reeves is the Commissioner of the Connecticut Department of Social Services and a member of Faith Congregational Church in

Hartford, CT. "The question posed in the title of her sermon, Jesus Loves the Little Children. Do We? was an invitation to interpret Matthew 18:1-5 in a new way, as well as a call to action," said Rev. Margret Hofmeister, Area Conference Minister, who staffed the contest review committee. Reeves' sermon will be presented during the Conference's online Martin Luther King, Jr. Day worship service on Monday, Jan. 15<sup>th</sup>.

## **GREEN TIP: Green Clothes**

How green are the clothes you are wearing? It can be challenging to discern this information, even from product labels. Yet a growing variety of environmentally friendly textiles are available for the choosy shopper. As a general rule, you can read the labels to find out if fabrics require dry cleaning or are treated with chemical flame retardants, and avoid buying them because they are not sustainable.
