

Notes on Today's Music

Thixo Onothando is a popular isiXhosa hymn performed throughout churches in South Africa. An uplifting song of praise, it is led by a group of soloists who personify the community's priestly leaders. The version of the song we hear today is an arrangement by Michael Barrett, who in 2015 was invited to hold workshops for community choirs in the Mpumalanga province, situated on the eastern border of South Africa. Barrett recalls: "a school choir sang this very simple religious hymn, and I remember being truly moved by their performance. I approached these learners and asked them to teach me this beautiful melody. I transcribed it, and a year later it was arranged for and performed by the Tuks Camerata at the South African University Choir Competition called Varsity Sing." The version by Barrett has become widespread in the United States and Europe following that initial exposure, opening new avenues to traditional South African sacred music to be honored and explored by the global church.

The Kingdom is one of many in the hit parade of songs by composer and conductor André J. Thomas, who for 35 years was Director of Choral Activities and Professor of Choral Music Education at Florida State University in Tallahassee. Never one to let the moss grow on the ever-rolling stone of his incredible life and career, Dr. Thomas has eschewed retirement in favor of a visiting professorship within Yale University's School of Music, where he currently leads the Yale Camerata in addition to his duties training the school's choral conducting students.

Organist and composer Mark Miller holds degrees from Yale University and the Juilliard School of Music. He currently serves as Lecturer in Sacred Music at Yale, Professor of Church Music and Composer-in-Residence at Drew Theological School, and Minister of Music at Christ Church in Summit, New Jersey. He has also held positions at Riverside Church and Marble Collegiate Church in New York.

Mark believes that music, social justice, and the beloved community are inextricably bound together and his rollicking setting of *Lift Every Voice and Sing* is an expression of that ideal. It is informed by musical styles from many lands and eras. The beginning consists of free, improvisatory passages suffused with jazz and gospel harmonies that give way to a French Romantic toccata. Here the influence of Louis Vierne, who served as organist of Notre Dame Cathedral in Paris from 1900 to 1937, is unmistakable. The toccata eventually dissolves into a somewhat dissonant climax before a recapitulation that harkens back to the beginning and leads to a frenzied conclusion.
